6.1	Town Councillor (STC – Shipston Town Council) Cllr I Cooper advised that Arthur Ivens (a previous Cllr and husband of Fay Ivens, a previous Cllr and Mayor) had sadly passed away. Clerk to send flowers and condolence card. Cllr Cooper reported that the Lions Food Festival had been a very successful event.	

	<ul> <li>Clir H Kelly advised that the official opening of Cornmill Meadows will be on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> October. Signs to be installed tomorrow and there is some more spraying of the thistles to be done. There has been some discussion re the footpath. Clir Kelly had also ran a stall at the Shipston Food Festival re food waste.</li> <li>Clir B Cooper made a request for some laminated signs for the location of the dog waste bin at Hanson Track.</li> <li>Clir Howarth reported on the success of the Museum – 25/30 people attending sessions, artifacts</li> </ul>
	brought in and new volunteers have signed up. Cllr Howarth had attended a Heart of Engand meeting re Riverside. <b>Cllr Booth</b> reported a request for the broken bench at the 'pound' to be replaced. This had been installed by a family – memorial plaque in safe keeping. Street furniture budget to be looked at. <b>Cllr Dinnie</b> reported that he had attended the WCC/EA meeting, the travel meeting, an SDC cabinet meeting and the riverside testing. He advised Council that Shipston Home Nursing are looking into the Bereavement Counselling Service 'letters to heaven' project. The gyratory would seem the ideal place – to be discussed with the Lions and the Legion.
6.2	<b>District Council issues (SDC – Stratford District Council)</b> <b>Cllr Passingham</b> reported on complaints re Housing Associations, public health issues (noisy neighbours), Donnington Road leak and the resurfacing of New Street and the Stratford Road in April. He had attended a meeting re grants for the Youth Club re grants for insulation/double glazing, seconded a motion at regarding beds at the Ellen Badger, attended the WCC/EA meeting and been in conference with Tesco re complying with the parking bays as per planning permission. <b>Cllr Hatch</b> reported on the river testing that had taken place prior to the meeting. This will be hopefully be carried out on a weekly basis. She also advised of some new climate change funding that is in the pipeline re reducing carbon emissions.
6.3	County Council issues (WCC – Warwickshire County Council) NTR in Cllr Barker's absence.
6.4	<ul> <li>Blue Light update – Safer Neighbourhood Team, Fire Station, First Responders.</li> <li>Safer Neighbourhood Team – busy month, 3 reports of domestic burglary and 10 business related, 5 violent incidents (arrests made), no major youth related incidents. Mental triage car no in place, speeding issues - speed watch to take place in October with assistance from Road Traffic and Road Safety. The force is currently in transition, the new PCSO is in place, no replacement PC to cover for sick leave in place as yet.</li> <li>First Responders – 1 community defibrillator activation this month but it was not needed in the end. Looking for somewhere to safely store training and event equipment which has easy access.</li> </ul>
6.5	<b>Shipston Forum</b> Editor advised that the October edition will be covering the food festival, the new town maps, Cornmill Meadows opening and a food bank appeal along with the usual articles.
6.6	<b>Ellen Badger Hospital</b> SDC are in support of inpatient beds. Meeting to take place with the Integrated Care Board on 20 <sup>th</sup> September. A discussion ensued regarding public consultation, SWFT, the Medial Centre and the League of Friends donation.
6.7	Stour Health and Wellbeing Partnership No meeting held in August.
6.8	Shipston High School Apologies received from Chair of Governors. Leak repaired by Severn Trent Water.

7	OPEN FORUM (15 MINUTE DURATION) Resident requested that Council recognise the achievements of Cecil Stanford, the oldest World Motorcycle Champion who is a Shipston resident. Details to be sent to the Cler, Cllr Howarth to speak to the Museum. Yet further requests for the allowing of bonfires and communal composting at the allotments. Cllr Dinnie requested that a detailed plan, with reasoning, be submitted. Cllr H Kelly advised of the grave environmental concerns re bonfires.
