INTRODUCTION - Chair Cllr Tesh welcomed all to a Planning Committee Meeting of Shipston Town Council.

- 2 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST** Cllr Tesh declared a non-pecuniary interest in item 5.1.1 as Taylor Wimpey a client elsewhere

5.1 NEW PLANNING APPLICATIONS

• 21/00716/FUL – Land on Campden Rd - Proposed new traffic light controlled junction to replace previously approved roundabout to serve the housing developments to the north and south of Campden Road.

Presentations and explanations from Alison Clack and Dave Farmer from Taylor Wimpey to explain position on areas of concern raised. Expressed empathy for TC's position to improve the area for residents and outlined their obligations with the junction proposal already having been through public enquiry and the current design agreed by WCC Highways. WCC will only accept a traffic light junction. The speed limit had already been reduced from 50mph to 40mph and that Police were not supporting a further reduction. Cllrs disappointed that WCC have not considered wider area and seemingly ignored the inadequate paths. TW had constraints of planning system not allowing for the changes STC would like, noting it had taken 2 years to secure technical approval. A signalised junction will slow traffic. TW happy to assist STC persuading Highways to improve paths but would have to be separate to the planning process.

Cllrs noted the redesign for point 1 of the original comment [risk of flood] should result in increased capacity for surface water run off and understands that points 2,3, & 4 [speed limit, widening of footpath east, improvement of footpath south] are not within the scope of this application.

Decision as below to withdraw the objection to the application, whilst still having reservations regarding the substandard footway connections at the Sadlers Avenue junction which, in their present configuration, will act as a deterrent to pedestrians and wheelchair users accessing the town's facilities. Pedestrian safety around the approaches remains a concern which STC will progress with Highways separately to the planning process.

Clir Westwood proposed objection be withdrawn as outlined [above] & that road safety concerns be progressed with WCC outside of the planning process, seconded by Clir Murphy – 5 for, 1 abstention – motion carried

- 21/00004/FUL Ellen Badger Hospital Erection of a Replacement Hospital (Including Well-Being Centre), Medical Centre, Cafe and Associated Infrastructure (including car parking and community garden) following demolition of the existing hospital and dwelling.
 - Cllrs still have reservations regarding the practicality of the underground surface water retention tank whilst the existing wing is retained in Phase 1 and during construction of phase 2. Clarification is sought on where the attenuation tank is in relation to the existing building and how surface water will be managed during these phases. The points addressed in correspondence from McLoughlin Planning were noted.
 - The location of disabled parking was a point of discussion (regarding ease of access to the building entrance) and STC would like to remain closely involved through ongoing consultation as further details develop.
 - <u>Cllr Tesh proposed that the application is supported, noting the concerns [above], seconded by Cllr Westwood unanimous for motion carried</u>
- 21/00542/FUL Silver Birches, London Rd Removal of wooden picket fence and wooden pedestrian gate at the front (road-facing) boundary of the house and to replace them with a fence and gate of the same style and dimensions.
 - Cllr Dinnie proposed no change to previous submission, seconded by Cllr Tesh unanimous for motion carried
